

#### From Lisa Riek Board President

Preparing for this concert has been an interesting experience (in a good way): we have members who are joining us on stage for the first time, women who started with CHARIS 19-20 years ago and everything in between. No matter what time period a song was performed by CHARIS there was a group of people that had sung it before. They were often surprised at how much they remembered (and in some cases, didn't



remember). Songs brought up memories which led to funny stories. We also gathered the chorus together for a viewing of "The Vegans of Provincetown." Those who were in the show (2007) got to reminisce and new singers got acquainted with a piece of CHARIS history.

HARIS was the realization of the dream of its founders Cindy Sohn and Juliet Jackson. With the guidance and support of the Gateway Men's Chorus (GMC), they organized the Committee to Unite Women Singers in the fall of 1992, with the goal of creating a chorus open to all women, regardless of cultural background or musical experience. CHARIS has always been a non-auditioned chorus.

The chorus made its first public appearance on May 23, 1993 at Trinity Episcopal Church in a fundraiser to benefit Northside AIDS Outreach. Shortly thereafter, CHARIS took the stage with GMC to perform at the latter's Pride Concert in 1993. CHARIS made its solo debut in October 1993 and has subsequently produced two to three solo performances along with community benefits each year.

Chorus highlights include a performance at the "Notes From Home" series at the Sheldon Memorial on January 24, 1995, at which time the chorus recorded "Dream In Color," its first commercially released tape. CHARIS hosted and performed at the 1995 Gay and Lesbian Association of Choruses (GALA) Leadership Conference for delegates from around the U.S. and a number of foreign countries. In 1996, CHARIS proudly performed in Tampa, Florida at GALA Festival V.

Merry Keller accepted the position of Artistic Director in January 2000. Many wonderful concerts ensued under her direction including "Sing for the Cure," a concert benefiting the Susan G. Komen Breast Cancer Foundation in June 2001 and CHARIS' tenth anniversary concert, "A Decade of Song," featuring special guest artist Holly Near.

Another era in CHARIS' legacy began in the chorus' 12th season with the leadership of new Artistic Director Aric Henson, former director of GMC's ensemble. During Henson's tenure, he directed CHARIS in "Postcards: Journeys of the Heart", "In The Groove" and "Fired Up!" a history of protest music with special guest artists, Symmetry. The 2006-2007 season was a banner year for the chorus and opened with


"Legends" featuring St. Louis' own legend, Kim Massie as the quest artist. In the spring, CHARIS staged the world premiere performance of "The Vegans of Provincetown," a witty and lesbian-friendly homage to Gilbert and Sullivan.

CHARIS' 15th anniversary season began in November 2007 with the Academy Awards tribute - "CHARIS Does Oscar." In April 2008, the chorus invited special guest artist Lisa Koch, a talented singer-songwriter and comedienne, to the stage for "CHARIS On The Couch." In July 2008, CHARIS members took to the stage in Miami and proudly shared their voices with thousands of other LGBT singers at the GALA Festival VIII.

CHARIS' 16th season began with an ending, as Artistic Director Aric Henson brought his tenure to a close. After leading CHARIS in a creative interpretation of "The Four Elements" in the fall of 2008, he handed the baton to our current Artistic Director, Kourtney R. Strade.

Strade officially took the helm in January 2009 and directed CHARIS through a musical journey of LGBT memoirs with "Coming Out" in May 2009. In CHARIS' 17th season, Strade led the chorus into new territory with two musicallychallenging offerings — November 2009's "Quantum Leap," a concert of music by women composers over the centuries, and May 2010's "Unplugged," an offering of a cappella numbers.

CHARIS opened our 19th season with "Women Who Rock," a celebration of women in the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame and took to the stage with "We Can Do It - A USO show." , CHARIS performed at our 3rd Gay and Lesbian Association of Choruses Festival in Denver CO last July. We began our twentieth anniversary season in November 2012 with "Love of Nature, Nature of Love." We, the women of CHARIS look forward to sharing positive messages about women through song along with you, our audience, as we continue creating the legacy of CHARIS!









After months of thinking and talking about it, I was finally attending my first rehearsal with CHARIS! I was a terrified bundle of nerves and wasn't quite sure what to expect. I am a transwoman and I had zero experience with any type of women's space at that point in my life. I wasn't sure I could be comfortable in such a space. I also had self-doubts about whether I could sing in the female range. In the end my need to sing in the appropriate voice was greater than my concerns.

I sat with the Alto 2 section (the lowest voice) as I wasn't certain which part I was capable of singing, but I was certain it was on the low end. Once I started getting settled in, I began to experience this wonderful thing called sisterhood that had seemed so elusive to me before. I tried singing a solo not too long after. Strangely enough, that song was "Seasons of Love", which is the title of our 20th anniversary concert.

The chorus as a whole has helped me become more secure not only in my own identity as a woman, but as a person in general. I truly cannot fathom what my life would be like without having been in CHARIS all these years! For me, CHARIS has been more than just an opportunity to sing again. It has been a positive, lifechanging experience!

I want to thank everyone I have had the honor of singing with and for, the artistic directors and accompanists. as well as all those who work behind the scenes allowing us to produce the beautiful music you hear onstage!

One of my favorite memories comes from an impromptu performance in the late 1990s at Our World Too, a gay bookstore owned by Bill Cordes. In those days the bookstore was the first place to go when you were coming out. You could find all sorts of gay and leshian books that no one else carried and you could get a copy of "The Lesbian and Gay News-Telegraph," the predecessor of the Vital Voice. All the LGBT groups had posters up at Our World Too. That's where I saw the announcement for open rehearsals that brought me into the chorus. Bill offered the basement of the store as a meeting place for support groups and for the community's gay hotline. He was a gentle man who knew how to put people at ease, especially during that first anxious trip to Our World

Bill asked CHARIS to sing at the store sometime, just for fun. One afternoon about 20 CHARIS members serenaded Bill and his customers with some CHARIS standards, including "Everything Possible," a lullaby that affirms every child's right to become who they are meant to be. The words, in part, go like this: "You can be anybody that you want to be. You can love whomever you will. You can travel any country where your heart leads and know that I will love you still. ....and the only measure of your words and your deeds is the love you leave behind when you're gone." We'd sung this song many times, but that day, as we sang, I looked up and saw Bill with tears rolling down his face. It moved me to see how we could touch him with our gesture of gratitude for all he had done for CHARIS and the community. It was a very special moment for me, and one I will never forget. - Dina Young (Alto II)

Dearest, sweetest, most beloved Women of CHARIS,

I first walked over the threshold to meet you nearly 20 years ago, only a few months after your founding birthday. It was a choice that changed my life.
