





PROGRAM NOTES

e're back! Charis' Spring concert continues our dedication to presenting music with a message. In this endeavor, Charis has teamed up with the talents of Joan Lipkin, St. Louis playwright and artistic director of That Uppity Theatre Company.

The first half of the new show is dedicated to the mother and nurturer in all of us. The music chosen reflects those issues with songs like On Children, originally by Sweet Honey and the Rock; Music in My Mother's House by Stuart Stotts; Three Seasons by Kent Newbury and Sky Dances by Jimmy Durham and Roy Brown.

For the second half of the performance, Charis and Lipkin present a parable dealing with intolerance and prejudice. Text written by Lipkin is intermingled with songs like Everybody Rejoice from The Wiz: the Swedish National Anthem; Orinoco Flo, originally by Enya; Wby by Tracy Chapman and Kill the Beast from Beauty and the Beast, adding dramatic highlights to the text and lesson learned.

"Charis is committed through our music to addressing issues that affect and impact our society," says Cindy Sohn, Charis director.

"Intolerance is a very serious topic, and we wanted to present it using the vehicle of humor-and it was Ioan's ability to take tough issues and find the humor in them that made her the perfect choice to work with Charis."

Of Mice and Wo(men), An Adaptation by Joan Lipkin Based Ever So Loosely on a Book that Dare not Speak its Name for Fear of Being Sued uses the device of a children's fairy tale. It is a story of a group of mice who decide they are tired of being treated like second class citizens having to meet in out of the way places like the produce department at Schnucks. When one of their members is attacked, they decide to escape to the moon. After all, they do say it's made of cheese! It's there they meet the other inhabitants of the moon and the tables are turned. They take a long look at the kind of mice they are becoming and, finally, learn a lesson about diversity.

"As I cannot sing a note, not even in the shower, I am delighted to be able to vocalize with Charis through this little parable," says Lipkin. "And with intolerance ever on the rise, I hope we will all be able to see ourselves in this story, especially those of us who most need to."

JOAN LIPKIN

oan Lipkin is a playwright, director, teacher and social critic. She is the artistic director of That Uppity Theatre Company where she founded the Alternate Currents/Direct Currents Series and After Rodney, a poetry performance group of white women and women of color. Lipkin is an official delegate from the United States to the Third International Conference of Women Playwrights to be held in Australia this summer.

Lipkin's award-winning work has been featured on television, radio and in print. Her plays include Some of My Best Friends Are..., He's Having Her Baby (co-written with Tom Clear), Love & Work & Other Four-Letter Words, Will the Real Foster Parent Please Stand Up?, The 1960's The Times They Were a 'Changin', One Sunday Morning and Small Domestic Acts.

Lipkin has long combined theatre and humor as a vehicle for social change. Written in part to repeal Missouri's Sexual Misconduct Law, the original production of Some of My Best

Friends Are was voted Best Play of the Year by both the Riverfront Times and Spotlight Magazine readers polls. Some of My Best Friends Are... is currently running in New York, along with He's Having Her Baby, a work which calls attention to the unfurling of American abortion laws.

Lipkin's latest play, Small Domestic Acts, recently finished a successful run in Chicago and will re-open at the St. Marcus Theatre in May. It has been optioned for publication by Chicago Plays and Nick Hern Books and is scheduled to be taped for broadcast on the BBC.

Lipkin's work is also featured in Upstaging Big Daddy: Directing Theater as if Gender and Race Matter, Contemporary Feminist Theatres: To Each Her Own, Monologues by Women for Women and in the forthcoming Feminists, Theatres, Social Change; Sexuality in Performance and in the Theatre Journal, TDR, New Theatre Quarterly and Critical Quarterly. She is a member of the Dramatists Guild.


