





# ARTISTIC DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE Merry Keller

Tonight, we invite you to travel with us to New York City. The time is right after the turn of the 20<sup>th</sup> century - the days of vaudeville and radio, when publishing houses sprang up overnight, eager to find the next "hit" song that would be played and sung by thousands of aspiring young piano students across the country. Tin Pan Alley, the descriptive name coined by a newspaper writer named Monroe Rosenfeld to symbolize the cacophony of the many pianos being played in all the publishing demo studios, was located on 28<sup>th</sup> street in New York, between 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue and Broadway, where a number of the more important publishers had offices. These are the days of George and Ira Gershwin, Dorothy Fields, Hoagy Carmichael, Cole Porter and Jerome Kern. These are the days before rock and roll, when a song's popularity was determined simply by the number of sheet music copies sold to the general public.

Don't be surprised by the appearance of an unlikely guest on our stage. She's come to share her memories of this special time in our country's history through the eyes and ears of one who grew up among the pianos and the individuals made famous through the songs they wrote. She offers a unique viewpoint through the lens of her personal experiences and offers insights, as one who was likely invisible to most, but was most assuredly in the center of all the flurry and excitement of the time.

The concert features the full chorus in many of the familiar love songs that have found their way into the repertoire of our hearts. How many of us learned the tune of *Heart and Soul*, pounding out the appropriate keys in coordination with a friend playing the repetitive, rhythmic accompaniment? Tonight you will be treated to an arrangement of the entire song, created especially to open this production.

The cabaret-style format of the show provides CHARIS the opportunity to highlight some of the great talent in our membership, as individuals and small groups entertain and thrill you with songs such as Dorothy Field's *I'm In the Mood for Love* and Cole Porter's sultry Night and Day. Tonight, we welcome to our stage the son of one of our singing members, Casey Fitzhugh, to sing It's Only a Paper Moon by Harold Arlen. And we especially welcome the Klassy Kickers, a tap dancing troupe, which performs all across the St. Louis region, dressing up our stage with two acts that take us directly to the vaudeville stage.



Merry's local performance experience includes The St. Louis Women's Chorale, Random Access, The St. Louis Chamber Chorus, several community-based groups, and solo performance in a variety of venues in the area. As a director and teacher, Merry Keller founded and directed a St. Louis community chorus in the Central West End, Centenary United Methodist Church Choir, helped produce musicals at Dignity House and a local children's community theater, and has taught privately and in the public school systems of Pennsylvania and Missouri.

With additional degrees in business and divinity, Merry is an ordained minister of the United Church of Christ. She has produced and hosted Steeple and People for KMOV, Channel 4, was Chaplain of Evangelical Children's Home and was Director of Development at Care and Counseling. Merry continues her ministry by providing music for services at Immanuel Congregational UCC.

In June of 2001, Merry Keller directed both CHARIS and the Gateway Men's Chorus in "Sing for the Cure," an amazing celebration of life in support of the St. Louis Affiliate of the Susan G. Komen Breast Cancer Foundation.

# CHARIS - The St. Louis Women's Chorus A History

CHARIS - The St. Louis Women's Chorus, was the realization of the dream of its founders Cindy Sohn and Juliet Jackson. With the guidance and support of the Gateway Men's Chorus (GMC), they organized a Committee to Unite Women Singers in the fall of 1992 with the goal of creating a chorus open to all women, regardless of cultural background or musical experience. The seed money for the group came from fundraising activities sponsored by the GMC.

Twenty-five women attended the first meeting of the chorus held in January 1993. An acting Board of Directors was appointed at that time to organize and direct the activities of the chorus. CHARIS was granted status as a not-for-profit organization by the State of Missouri on September 27, 1993, and received conformation of its tax-exempt status as a 501c(3) corporation in July, 1994.

Since January 1993, the members of CHARIS have met weekly to learn and rehearse music, develop musical skills and vocal technique, and broaden their range of musical experiences. CHARIS is a non-auditioned chorus with both experienced singers and members with less musical training. Chorus members and section leaders work in sectionals and with practice tapes to memorize music and improve pitch and vocal quality.

The chorus made its first public appearance on May 23, 1993, at Trinity Episcopal Church in a fundraiser to benefit Northside AIDS Outreach. Shortly thereafter CHARIS took the stage with the Gateway Men's Chorus to perform at the latter's Pride Concert in June 1993. CHARIS made its solo debut in October 1993, at the Center of Contemporary Arts, drawing a total audience of over 700 people for its two performances. The chorus has subsequently produced two to three solo performances, with additional three or four guest appearances, each year.

Chorus highlights include a performance at the "Notes From Home" series at the Sheldon Memorial on January 24, 1995 at which time the chorus recorded "Dream In Color," its first commercially released tape. CHARIS

hosted and performed at the 1995 Gay and Lesbian Association of Choruses (GALA) Leadership Conference for delegates from around the United States and a number of foreign countries. In 1996, after much rehearsal and a major fundraising effort, CHARIS proudly performed in Tampa, Florida at GALA Festival V. Through the years, CHARIS has donated its time for many benefit performances to aid organizations such as the Cathedral Mission Society, Metropolitan Food Pantry Association, The NAMES Project, Habitat for Humanity, and Parents, Families, and Friends of Lesbians and Gays (PFLAG).

Merry Keller came to CHARIS as Interim Director in 1999. Merry's exceptional leadership skills and strong background in music, both as a performer and a teacher, provided valuable assets to the chorus. The match between chorus and director was made permanent when Merry accepted the position of Artistic Director in January 2000. From that time to the present Merry and CHARIS have successfully produced many full concerts such as: "Heart of a Woman," featuring songs about the many aspects of love, and "Rainbow World," a family concert featuring the CHARIS kids. With the Gateway Men's Chorus, CHARIS presented "Sing for the Cure," a concert benefitting the Susan G. Komen Breast Cancer Foundation in June 2001. Recent concert include "CHARIS Sings the Blues," featuring Denise Thimes, at the Grandel Theatre in November 2001, "Changing Woman," a collaboration with Gash/Voigt Dance Company, in June 2002, and "A Labyrinth of Song" at the St. Louis Art Museum in November 2002.

After moving to a new and spacious rehearsal site at Immanuel Congregational United Church of Christ, CHARIS celebrated its tenth anniversary with the production of "A Decade of Song" featuring special guest star, Holly Near. With a talented board of both singers and non-singers addressing management issues and with Merry's wise and able artistic direction, the chorus is looking forward to sharing its voices and vision with its audiences for many years to come.
